Question	Answer			
Are you able to clarify if ambulatory surgical facilities' employees should be wearing eye protection when dealing with pre-screened and asymptomatic patients?	Yes, eye protection (i.e., goggles or a face shield that covers the front and sides of the face) is now recommended for all healthcare settings in addition to a facemask to ensure the eyes, nose, and mouth are protected from exposure to respiratory secretions for all patient care encounters.			
Regarding eye protection, are prescription eyeglasses enough and then protective glasses for those who do not wear prescription glasses?	Eyewear (prescription eyeglasses, safety glasses, or trauma glasses) with gaps between glasses and the face likely do not protect eyes from all splashes and sprays.			



SOME QUESTION(S) RECEIVED RECENTLY				
Question	Answer			
The current Department of Health guidance refers skilled nursing facilities to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) data site to determine the positivity rate in their county (which determines their screening testing intervals). Can we use state data instead?	CMS has clarified that a facility may choose the data source for their county's positivity rate. A facility may choose the <u>CMS data</u> , <u>PA Department</u> <u>of Health data</u> , or another published source such as county data. Once the facility has chosen their data source, they must continue to use that same source. If the facility chooses a source other than CMS, they must document that the selected source provides more current data than CMS.			
A resident was admitted to our skilled nursing facility with a test pending from the hospital and the facility subsequently received the result as a positive. Is this to be reported to Survey 123 as a positive case for our facility?	Yes, it is to be reported to Survey 123 as a positive case for the facility.
